GENERAL COMMENTS

The 2020 EPC external examination had **26 637** candidates who sat for Religious Education. This shows a decrease of candidates compared to **28 015** in 2019.

The overall candidate's performance for the 2020 was good hence the highest candidate was able to score 95% while the lowest score was 00%.

The question paper had three sections which carries 20 marks each. Candidates were expected to answer all questions. Each question consisted of structured questions which covered the three assessment domains:

- Knowledge and understanding
- Analysis and interpretation
- Evaluation

The candidates performed well in the knowledge and understanding questions while they had challenges in analysis, interpretation and evaluation questions. However, there is a great improvement in the evaluation questions compared to the previous years.

Candidates found question 3 more assessable compared to questions 1 and 2. This was due to the fact that candidates were able to relate the biblical stories with what the examiner required. Some candidates lost marks due to incorrect spelling and responding in siSwati. Candidates also had challenges with interpreting the key words in the questions.

COMMENTS ON SPECIFIC QUESTIONS

Candidates were expected to answer all questions, using short sentences or phrases in the spaces provided.

QUESTION

1 (a) (i) Name the first <u>two</u> human beings that were created by God in the beginning according to the Bible.

Expected responses:

· Adam and Eve

Common wrong response:

- Man and a woman
- Eva
- Old Testament and New Testament
- (ii) Mention what the spirit of God was doing when the earth was without void.

Expected responses:

Moving over the surface of water

- Void
- Busy creating the earth
- It was moving through the world
- The earth was formless and dark

(iii) Describe how the first women came into being according to the creation story in the bible.

Expected responses:

- God said it is not good for man to be alone
- I will make a helper suitable for him
- God cause a deep sleep fall upon man
- Took one of his ribs and close it up with flesh
- From the rib God made the woman

Common wrong response:

- God uses dust from the ground to make a woman
- He uses His hands to make a woman
- He breath on her nostrils
- He created Eve from His image
- He took a rib of Adam and put it to Eve

(b) (i) What is learnt about the character of the serpent that appeared to Eve in the Garden of Eden?

Expected responses:

- Skillful because it tempted Eve to eat the tree of knowing good and evil
- The serpent was deceitful and a liar because it convinced Eve to eat the fruit that so that they will be clever like God
- Convincing, the snake made Eve to eat the fruit

- A serpent was a snake
- She came to Eve and told her to eat the fruit so that she will be clever like God
- A snake or a devil told Adam and Eve to eat the fruit that God said they must not eat so that they will be like God
- God punishes sin
- A person must not tell lie to other people like the serpent

(c) Do you think Eve was responsible for the fall of man?

Give reasons for your answer.

Expected responses:

Yes.

- Eve was responsible because she listened to the serpent
- · She was the first person to eat the forbidden fruit
- She was easily convinced by the snake even though God had given them an instruction not to eat the forbidden fruit
- She was the one who gave Adam the fruit to eat

No.

- · Eve should have consulted Adam before she ate the forbidden fruit

- Means a son who was lost and found

(iii) Describe the action of the elder brother when his younger brother came back home.

Expected responses:

- He claimed to be righteous he told his father that he has been with him
- · He reacted with anger and discouragement
- He stood outside father's house and not go in
- He complained that he was treated unfairly
- He was jealous because his father did not slaughter a beast for him

Common wrong response:

- Old brother thought that his father will give him his share
- While he was in the field he heard a loud voice and he was wondering what was happening
- He asked one of his father's servant on what was happening
- He was told that his younger brother is back

Expected responses:

Pharisees, unforgiving Christians

Common wrong responses:

Devil, first born, seed, Satan, older boy at home, Christian

Expected response:

Common wrong responses:

• Cloth, young son, sinners, un-trustable friends, the people who robe, Angels

Expected responses:

Love, affection, new covenant

Expected responses:

God

Common wrong responses:

- · Jesus, a person who lead the family
- A man with children

(ii) What two lesson can be learnt from the parable of the prodigal son?

Expected responses:

- God is always ready and waiting for our return to Him with open arms
- God's love is abundant and His mercies always triumphs
- We must guard our hearts from self-righteousness and critical attitude towards our brothers and sisters
- Never judge people about their past
- There is always a second chance to do the right thing
- There is joy in heaven when one sinner repents

- God do not spend time on holy people, but spend time on those who are called by the Devil.
- We learn that the son helped people how to worship God

(c) Do you think the Father did well to celebrate the return of the prodigal son instead of celebrating the older brother for always being good?

Expected responses:

Common wrong response:

Common wrong response:

- When he is hungry give him food, thirsty give him water to drink

The Bible teaches us to forgive seventy times seven (70x7).

Common wrong response:
